

Dear Friends,

December and January embrace times of traditional celebration: Christmas and New Year bring us together with family, friends and neighbours in a distinct way. We mark the season with gifts and merriment. This is usually a time when life's problems are put aside for a while and enjoyment takes centre stage – at least that's how we like to think of it!

For many, of course, this mid-winter national marking of the year is not particularly a time of ease and wellbeing, especially for those struggling to make ends meet: the bereaved for whom this period marks poignant remembrance of loss, either recent or some time past; those struggling with loneliness, incapacity or illness. It means happiness for some; challenging times for others. This Christmas and New Year may, indeed, bring an overload of care for many.

Those in need have always been a particular care of the Church, as a fellowship of believing people. This year, as always, your parish church of St Lawrence will be lovingly decorated for the Christmas season. A beautiful church is designed to reflect the beauty of its message of peace, reconciliation, brotherly love and God's care for each of us as individuals. Care for each individual's wellbeing is a sentiment widely used by those in secular national authority. It is expressed in such phrases as 'levelling up', indicating potential ways in which the under-privileged can be given better resources to improve their lot.

'Levelling up' could well be a phrase used by the Christian community, because in the birth, mission, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ we can see the ultimate 'levelling up'. In meeting Christ, those who had 'hit the skids' found new life by means of forgiveness and healing – physical, psychological and emotional – and those who were waiting for news to give them hope and inspiration found it in Jesus' teaching and in their contact with him.

Going into 2023 and beyond, God, shown in Jesus, has a care for everyone, no matter what their circumstances. Christmas displays 'light shining in the darkness': a light that doesn't disappear with the switching off of Christmas lights and New Year decorations.

Crime Awareness

PCSO Jonathan Flower would like to remind all residents that now the darker evenings are here there are a few precautions we can all take to keep our properties safe.

• Leave a light on in more than one room, such as the lounge and bedroom. Remember to choose low-energy lamps.

- Use a timer switch to operate the lights as it starts to get dark.
- Change the times that the lights come on to create the illusion that someone is moving around inside the home.

• Consider the use of 'smart' technology to have different lights coming on in your house at different times.

• Make sure your front door is well lit and fully visible from the street. Also think about security lighting at the rear and side of your property.

• Keep shrubbery and hedges at the front pruned to below 1 metre to remove cover for a burglar to work unseen and allow visibility by neighbours.

- Consider having a good quality CCTV system installed.
- Keep your curtains closed at night if you are away, ask a neighbour to close them for you.
- Check existing lighting is in good working order and replace any faulty equipment.
- Remember to check batteries in torches and smoke alarms.
- Lock all windows and doors even when you are at home.
- Put the alarm on even when you go out and at night
- Don't leave valuable items or car keys on view near your front door.
- Photograph your property and register it free of charge

BARLOW CofE SCHOOL 1872 – 2022



Dear Friends,

We are busy preparing for Christmas at school. Enterprise happened at the beginning of the month. The children made a variety of decorations and products for their parents to buy. FOBS (Friends of Barlow School) supported the event by providing teas and coffees and parents provided cakes to be sold.

Now the focus turns to the Christmas celebrations. Children in Key Stage 1 have been busy practising for their nativity. This year's production is Babushka. All the children are acting, singing and narrating, so their classrooms have been echoing to the music for the past month or so. Meanwhile Key Stage 2 have been preparing for the Christingle service which also includes building the nativity scene. Our plan is to finish with all the children singing while holding their lit Christingle. As well as the nativities, there will be Christmas Dinner, Party Lunch and Christmas Jumper Day. Somehow, in amongst all of this, the children will be continuing with all their usual learning, though some of it will have a distinct Christmas flavour!

In November, we took part in several sports events. The first event was Cross Country. Representatives from Y3, 4, 5 and 6 gathered together with several other schools at Mount St Mary's to run the course – 1200m for Y3 and 4 and 1600m for Y5 and 6. Conditions were rather muddy underfoot and the distance was a long way. Everyone walked the course first, so they were clear about the route. Each year group set off in turn and were loudly cheered on by all the other children. Everyone gave it their all and the children supported each other, particularly down the final

part of the course when everyone was very tired. 
Here is a short excerpt:






