Some of us like football, some like cricket, some like tennis. If you don't like tennis you had better keep your TV off between the 3<sup>rd</sup> and the 16<sup>th</sup> of July, because that's the Wimbledon fortnight! It is one of the world's most celebrated tennis events, as well as a celebration of sport that marks a particular moment in British summertime. Pimm's, strawberries and sunburn – it is part of the British national consciousness. Like it or not, you've got to be impressed by some of the facts: More than 54,000 tennis balls are used during the Championship. Wimbledon is the largest single annual sporting catering operation in Europe: serving 234,000 meals, 330,000 cups of tea and coffee, 140,000 portions of English strawberries, 10,000 litres of dairy cream and 29,000 bottles of champagne, amongst other things. Oh, and the grass on the courts is cut to a height of exactly 8 mm... You could try that with your own lawn...!



#### **Dear Friends**,

'Game, set, match!'



This month features a national sporting event of international interest: the Wimbledon Tennis Tournament. Some of us are gripped (the 'saddest' amongst us – including myself – will have followed some of the key players through the previous Queens and Eastbourne tournaments...)! As I follow the in-match fortunes of these top players, sometimes I wonder if we're witnessing what we could think of as an allegory for our own lives. However modest, we all have our hopes and aspirations that we enter the court of life with – both for ourselves and others, e.g. our children. We enter the arena with hopes, if not expectations. But, like the tennis players, before the first game is won or lost, there is the point-by-point struggle: the daily grind, according to our skills and abilities; that expertise put into our daily work in our jobs or professions; these meticulous hours of study of a chosen subject. (At this time of year, we think especially of our young folk who have just completed their GCSEs and A-levels and those doing university exams.)

Then comes the game ending: that promotion gained or exam passed – and so on to 'set'. The games of our lives come together: we meet that special person; may raise a family; buy/rent a house and begin to acquire all those aspects of modern life that go to make up what marks out living in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

Then, of course, there's 'match': all the sets of our lives come together. We may consider each as won or lost but, fortunately, the picture however much we may consider our lives as not entirely well-spent in all departments - is always positive somewhere: maybe there is appreciation from someone to whom we've given encouragement or a helping hand at some point, or whatever... (I have never seen a tennis match where a player has never won a single point or game!) At 'match' we may, in the ripeness of time, weigh everything up.

But one last thing remains to be said: what about winning the championship?

St Paul wrote:

'Everyone who competes in the games trains with strict discipline. They do it for a crown that is perishable, **but we do it for a crown that is** 

imperishable....' In the light of how we conduct our lives, Christian faith teaches that we can all be victors. In the words of the old song: 'It ain't what you do, it's the way that you do it!' Blessings, Janet (Rev'd Janet Quick)



#### Poppies

This event was very well patronised and many of the local residents present were able to ask questions concerning local as well as national issues they were concerned about and given the opportunity to respond to Lee's answers.

21 million scam emails reported

Almost 21 million reports have been made to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS), resulting in the removal of over **235,000 malicious websites**.

SERS was launched by the <u>National Cyber Security</u> <u>Centre</u> (NCSC) and the City of London Police in April 2020 to enable the public to forward suspicious emails to an automated system that scans them for malicious links. Since its launch, almost 21 million reports have been made to the service.

Mobile phone providers also offer a service that allows customers to report suspicious text messages, by forwarding them to the number **7726**. The service is free of charge and enables providers to takedown malicious websites and block malicious texts from being sent across their network.

As of 31 May 2023, **54,000 text message scams have been removed** as a result of suspicious texts forwarded to the 7726 service.

### Commander Nik Adams, from City of London Police, said:

"Every year, thousands of people in the UK are scammed by a fraudulent email or text message. Phishing scams, whether it's a text message claiming you have missed a delivery and are required to pay a redelivery fee, or an email claiming to be from your bank are a common security challenges that both individuals and businesses across the UK face on a daily basis. "If you receive an email or text message that you think might be a scam, don't respond to it or click any links in the message or email. Instead, contact the organisation directly using contact information from the company's official website, and not the links or numbers provided in the message itself.

"If you think you have been a victim of fraud, report it to Action Fraud at <u>www.actionfraud.police.uk</u> or by calling 0300 123 2040. By reporting phishing scams or suspected fraud, you are directly helping us in our work to identify and stop these criminals and helping us protect others from these scams. If you are in Scotland, I ask that you report the fraud directly to Police Scotland by calling 101."

#### How to protect yourself from scam emails and texts

Received an email or text that seems suspicious? Report it. Your reports enable us to remove the emails and websites criminals use to commit fraud and cyber crime.

#### 1: Forward suspicious emails

to <u>report@phishing.gov.uk</u>. Send emails to this address that feel suspicious, even if you're not certain they're a scam - we can check.

2: Forward suspicious text messages to 7726 (it's free of charge). Your provider can find out where the text came from and block or ban the sender.

**3:** If you've lost money or provided personal information as a result of a phishing scam, notify your bank immediately and report it to Action Fraud at <u>www.actionfraud.police.uk</u> or by calling 0300 123 2040. In Scotland, call Police Scotland on 101.

Please note: Sometimes a forwarded email may not reach us because it is already recognised by spam detection services. You can also take a screenshot of the email and send it to <u>report@phishing.gov.uk.</u>


### **BARLOW PRE-SCHOOL**



#### **Book recommendations**

#### You wait for months for somebody to send one in and then TWO come along at once...

#### Homegoing by Yaa Gyasi

This is a thought provoking and superbly written book about an extremely ugly part of history, i.e. slavery. An horrific subject – yes – but a book that is hard to put down!

The novel highlights the legacy of both the people who were captured and enslaved and those who took them. The storytelling is poetic, beautiful and savage all at once. It commences in 18<sup>th</sup> century Ghana and echoes through the generations covering two and a half centuries.

It offers insight into the guilt shared by both white and black parties in the overall 'human trade'. In this case two strings of the same family via half-sisters and their descendants. The sisters have savagely different fates. One sister is captured whilst the other remains safe having married an English officer. What happens over the ages to the two families is outlined sensitively, vividly and utterly memorably. *Gill Mellor* 

#### Washington Black by Esi Edugyan

Quite by coincidence, I would like to recommend another book that deals with slavery and graphically depicts the inhuman conditions for slaves on a sugar plantation in Barbados in the 1830s. Shortlisted for the Booker Prize, it tells the adventurous story of a young, uneducated and orphaned slave boy who gets chosen by an eccentric abolitionist to assist him with his scientific experiments. He builds a flying machine with which they both escape from the island, embarking on a romp to the Canadian Arctic, the streets of London and the Moroccan desert. It is a captivating story of explorer adventure, fantasy and romance. The book deals with the complexities of race, relationships, betrayal, science and art and asks the question what freedom really is.

The book is highly entertaining and educational in equal measure. A brilliant read!


