Dear Readers,

I don't know about you but, for me the word 'April' as a month, and the idea of moving into it, bucks me up! It somehow holds a sense of promise, of good times / things to come: More sunny days (less gloom); longer daylight (less darkness); more flowers (fewer bare trees and dry foliage); more relaxation / me-time (holiday thoughts rather than nose-to-the-grindstone).

We can't get away from the fact that we are part of nature, part of the world order and whatever changes take place are bound to affect us – like the changing seasons. We were created alongside everything else – vegetation, all creeping things, things flying and walking!

We often have a tendency to forget this 'oneness with nature'. Perhaps this may not be the case so much in farming communities like Barlow, which rely on nature for business! But farmers' time must be very much taken up with practical issues. I'm suggesting a view we can all embrace, regardless of one's job. The good Lord has put us in a special place, as humans, but this doesn't remove our being part of all things. (The astrophysicists - those who study the universe – remind us that we are, ultimately, star dust!)

Now all this, I think, can buoy us up in difficult times: To know that we, as individuals, have a rightful place in the order of things. The Psalms in the Bible are very good, and a worthwhile read, at helping us remember this: How many are your works, O Lord. In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures (Ps 104). And: What is man that you are mindful of him ... yet you have made him little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honour (Ps 103). Despite our elevated place and powers, we are part of nature and cannot be separated from it.

Ok, so how does this help me when I'm facing a health discomfort or juggling my bank balance to pay the bills? Well, they (these one-ness with God's nature thoughts) might just remind you that you have the dignity, equality and rights of all created things – regardless of how your fellow humans might think they can treat you! In religious / Christian terms, this is expressed as 'God's care is for each of us, without exception and without limit'. And don't forget, with Easter just over, that a Saviour died, some 2,000 years ago, to make this exact point!

Collective Worship

OFSTED

Ofsted visited school just before half term. We are so pleased to share with you that Ofsted judged that we continue to be a good school. Please see below for two extracts from the report:

"What is it like to attend this school?

Pupils are happy to attend Barlow C of E Primary School. In lessons, they keenly follow well-established routines. They enjoy learning and try hard. At playtimes, pupils play together in the well-equipped outdoor space. In daily collective worship, they learn about values and diversity. Staff encourage pupils to reflect on these values and make links to their own behaviour.

What does the school do well and what does it need to do better?

The school has worked hard to plan a rich and ambitious curriculum. Staff have thought carefully about the knowledge that they want pupils to learn across the full range of subjects. This knowledge is effectively sequenced so that pupils build on what they already know to deepen their understanding over time. Staff work together to make sure that the curriculum matches pupils' interests and broadens their understanding of the world they live in."




Sporting Activities
