Dear Readers,

'Now is the month of Maying'

Many years ago when I was a student nurse in Oxford, I used to join the crowds who got up early on the 1st May to make their way to Magdalen Bridge, in order to hear the choristers of the college chapel sing hymns and songs from the top of the tower - and then go off and celebrate. Or maybe we stayed up all night celebrating beforehand, I can't remember.....

Probably the most famous madrigal they sing dates from the late 1500s;

Now is the month of maying, When merry lads are playing, Fa la la la la la la la la, Fa la la la la la la la la. Each with his bonny lass Upon the greeny grass, Fa la la la la la la la, etc...

This celebration of the1st of May is mirrored by other local events around the country as we celebrate that spring is truly here and that summer is just around the corner. There's the sense that this 'is it', there's proof of thriving new life all around us, from the fast growing lambs in the fields to the flowers blooming everywhere – in gardens and hedgerows alike.

In the Christian tradition, this 'is it' too - we are celebrating the Easter Season. As with Christmas, Easter is not just one day but several weeks, a time to remember the stories of Christ's resurrection and the events surrounding it. In church we listen to the accounts of the impact of these events on Jesus' followers who (in the book of Acts) start to process what has happened and share the good news of Jesus with others, with astonishing results. We read of how they sought to model their lives on his - living in community, sharing equally all their possessions and caring for the most vulnerable in their society. Not that it was easy - we also learn about how they struggled with division and attempted to deal with conflict. But one of the most striking aspects for me is the way that people found the courage to speak out for what is right, to give voice to their convictions in the face of opposition and persecution. The reason they could do so, of course, is because they were Easter people - they experienced the power of new life in Jesus.

Life is different for us today in Barlow, but nonetheless Easter joy is still tangible and a reminder that we too are Easter people. So in the coming weeks we will continue to celebrate Easter as we approach Pentecost - Whit Sunday (19th May), when we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit in fire and flame to inspire Jesus' first followers - and which continues to do so today.

Flame-dancing Spirit, come, Sweep us off our feet and Dance us through our days. Surprise us with your rhythms, Dare us to try new steps, explore New patterns and new partnerships. Release us from old routines, To swing in abandoned joy And fearful adventure. And in the intervals, Rest us, In your still centre.

A wooden beam in a chimney of the Travellers' Rest, Barlow, caught fire on Sunday morning. The Chesterfield Fire Brigade were telephoned for by the owner of the premises, but the superintendent declined to respond as the call had not come from an authorised person. The fire was quickly extinguished. There is an agreement between the Barlow Parish Council and the Chesterfield Corporation for the Brigade to attend fires in their district, but it is necessary to summon the Brigade through an authorised person.

Logic Puzzles:




