

#### Dear Friends,

Who could fail to be uplifted by the colourful beauty and perfection of flowers? Jesus said of flowers, 'not even Solomon, in all his glory, was arrayed like one of these'.

And so, whether you have a belief in the Divine or not, looking at beauty in nature can surely be more than viewing something pretty; it can be a window through which we can feel and catch a glimpse of that certain something of the spirit which can uplift and – ultimately – sustain us.

More people are always welcome.





#### Father's Day Run

The organisers of this year's Father's Day Run have sent us the following assessment of the event:

# Follow-up to the 2025 Father's Day Classic Run

Good evening everyone!

Just a quick update following a very successful Father's Day Classic Run last Sunday.

We had a full entry of a little over 50 cars (we did creep over our set limit of 50) and thankfully the new start and finish venue, Barlow Village Hall,

worked very well indeed. We were lucky with the weather which meant that entrants could make use of the outdoor space and there was ample car parking space. We even had several visitors to the site to see the cars both at the start and the finish.

We raised the whopping sum of £2200 which we will split equally between The British Heart Foundation and Weston Park Cancer Charity. This fantastic total was only possible because of the very healthy entry list, the generosity of entrants buying raffle tickets and of course the superb support of our sponsors Buckingham Insurance Consultants. Other organisations, such as JPGrafix (Rally Plates), Barlow Parish Council (the use of the village hall) and Buxton Pavilion (for the superb lunch halt parking on the promenade) all helped us keep the overheads down so that we could maximise our takings to pass on to the chosen charities.

Finally please note that we have started taking entries for both the Tally Ho (17th May 2026) and the Father's Day Run (21st June 2026) and I would urge you not to leave your entry too late as this year the entry list filled up very quickly.

The Tally Ho will start and finish on the Welbeck Estate, not in Sheffield, as on previous years. The route for this event will go out to the east into Lincolnshire and North Notts whereas the Father's Day Run will start and finish at Barlow Village Hall and take in areas to the west of Chesterfield.




#### **Forest School**


#### **School Show**



# **BARLOW CARNIVAL**

#### Friends,

Firstly, thank you to all those who came to the family fun day on 25<sup>th</sup> May. Although the weather was a bit windy, we managed to avoid the rain and everyone seemed to enjoy the day, including the entertainment in the marquee. Apologies for the absence of the bouncy castles and inflatables, we had to cancel them due to safety reasons.

Well, it's getting closer, and as promised we will now highlight the entertainment planned for this year's carnival and a few other activities planned in July.

#### **Carnival Saturday**

This year we have more entertainment throughout the day to provide even more fun. On Saturday in the arena we will have a BMX stunt display team, Dog and Duck display, several dance displays and the Barlow Red Barrows, fresh from their appearance on Britain's Got Talent. At the Bar Stage, Kimmo will be doing his best to entertain kids of all ages throughout the day and in the bar we will have a live band to entertain during the day. Entertaining the crowds we also have a couple of walk-around acts, including stilt walkers and the Pirates of Northants, mobile impersonators playing 80s songs. # **BARLOW HISTORY**



Mabel Amelia Radford 1860 – 1940 ?

#### From the Evans family archive:

Mabel Amelia Radford was one of the school teachers at Barlow School, some time in the early years of the nineteen hundreds. The photograph was probably taken between 1893 and 1897, before she was married. She would be 20 or 21 years old. In those days, when a teacher married she always left work.

This picture shows her on the steps of old front door of the school, posing with other members of staff. The man, presumably, is the headmaster. Notice how proudly he is showing off his gold watch chain.

We know that Mabel had a great sense of fun, because her grandson remembers all the laughter whenever she came to visit. She married a local builder, George Wright of Barlow. She had four daughters and was widowed when George died at the age of 43, leaving her to bring them up on her own in difficult times and circumstances. She is buried in Barlow churchyard.

Her four daughters had nine children, who in time had children of their own. Many members of this large family used to come to Barlow on high days and Carnival days.

One of Mabel's grandchildren, Barrie Evans, lived and raised his family here in Barlow, at Middle Barlow, on the alley near the church. In 1973 his children, James, Claire and Lindsay Evans helped to celebrate the centenary of Barlow School, where their great-grandmother had been a teacher.

James was also buried in Barlow churchyard, like his great-grandmother Mabel Amelia Wright.
